I feel that during the coming year volunteers and staff should attend as many education workshops as possible and request the board members to be alert to workshops that would benefit us.

Staff's recommendation for first half of 2nd year for Program Development -

1. Developing volunteer participation & responsibility in services currently available thru SURVIVORS, INC.
2. Increase public awareness thru -
  - a. publicity - newspaper, radio, monthly releases (TV a possible goal later)
  - b. speaking - churches, social organization, schools ( have volunteers in those areas develop programs)
  - c. introduce issue to public school classes (at jr. high & senior high level)
  - d. develop college program (re: dating violence information)
3. concentrate efforts on improving systems, developing record keeping/service & volunteers, so that it is as fast & accurate as possible.
4. fall volunteer training - program should be a major recruitment effort.
5. It is important we have some rape/incest training for staff and volunteers ( most of our calls involve these two issues in some form).
